

01. **Extracurriculars Defined**

An extracurricular is virtually any activity that isn't required for high school credit. Think "extracurriculum" — anything you do beyond the required academics. These include:

While grades and test scores demonstrate your academic prowess, extracurricular activities reveal your personality, emotional intelligence, and personal growth.

In order to get into a top university, your personal brand must be concise yet compelling. In approximately 4 minutes, an admissions officer needs to know who you are, and how you are an asset to your community. This will help them decide if you will positively contribute to and serve the campus community upon



When admissions officers read your university application, academics are the first thing they look at. However, while top grades and test scores can help your application get past admissions officers' first glance, your personal brand (including your extracurriculars, leadership positions, and personal experiences) is what truly sets you apart from the crowd!

Building a Strong, Authentic Personal Brand

In summary, your academics show what you can do, but your extracurriculars help demonstrate who you are. Your academics and extracurricular activities must come together in your application, essay, and interview in the form of your personal brand.

Here are some questions for you to consider when thinking about whether you've cultivated a clear and powerful personal brand for a successful college application.

- 01. What story do you want to tell about who you are as a person, and how do your extracurriculars tell that story?
- 02. Do your academics, achievements, and extracurriculars come together cohesively in a powerful, compelling manner?
- 03. Does your personal brand clearly demonstrate a commitment to excellence and strong moral character?
- 04. Can you distil your activities and achievements into 3-4 adjectives that accurately describe who you are?
- 05. Can you distil each activity and achievement into a 150 character summary that contributes to your personal brand?

02. 5 Ways to Build Outstanding Extracurriculars

Talents and Interests

Perhaps the simplest way to build outstanding extracurriculars is through your talents and interests. You already need extracurriculars, so you might as well do something you're already good at and/or love! Your commitment to these activities will quickly and easily demonstrate your personal qualities and your dedication to excellence.

So, what talent or interest do you enjoy spending time on? Perhaps you're an athlete or a musician? Business owner or a Twitch streamer? Leverage what you already love doing to help tell a compelling story about yourself to admissions officers!

However, if your portfolio shows a limited range of extracurriculars, we recommend finding small ways to increase the variety of your activities to show other sides of yourself beyond that one talent or interest.

Community Service

The second way to build outstanding extracurriculars is through community service. Why? Well, community service is exactly as it sounds — how are you serving your community?

So, by living, working, learning, and playing in a community, you are already contributing to it in small ways. The trick here is, are you taking initiative and going above and beyond what is expected of you? Are you a demonstrated leader? Do your community members ask you to take on additional responsibilities? Have you helped expand the community or initiative you're involved in? How are you leaving this community better than you found it?

Admissions officers love to see community service in an application because it demonstrates two important qualities: impact and passion.

Internships

An internship is a job you can take on to learn more about the work industry you are interested in. Unlike community service or volunteerism, internships are focused on providing practical, workplace-related experience.

Completing an internship during high school can give you a competitive edge when applying for college or university programs, as it demonstrates your commitment and passion for a particular field. For instance, if you're considering a career in medicine, an internship at a hospital can help you stand out as a strong candidate and also allows you to gain a better understanding of the field and apply that knowledge to your studies.

Good places to find internship opportunities:

- Small businesses in your community
- Non-profits, social service industries, and charities
- Personal connections (family members, family friends, etc.)
- Online initiatives (blogs, social media, etc.)
- Dedicated high school internship programs

Research and Competitions

Participation in research and/or competitions illustrates academic competence and an eagerness to learn outside the classroom. It shows that you're not only curious about the knowledge that currently exists, but that you're interested in developing new knowledge and can contribute to your field.

Pursuing a research program or collaborating on a research project shows initiative and intellectual curiosity. In most cases, academic research opportunities within the high school curriculum are limited, so it is important to reach into an academic network outside of your community to see what's possible!

It is also important to pair your research with competition.
Competitions allow for you to further develop your research through practical application. Competitions require long-term preparation and dedication and if you perform well, it indicates a high level of self-sufficiency and knowledge in a topic of your choice.

Admissions officers are not only looking for people who want to contribute to their field in new ways, but also people who are not afraid and welcoming of conflict as it relates to their own research. Participating in competitions can demonstrate your ability to navigate healthy conflict, and also shows your resilience and ability to bring critical thinking within an academic field!

Capstone Projects

While this may sound intimidating, a capstone project is an independent project you can take on during your high school years. It showcases selfdriven exploration of a topic or objective you're interested in. This is different from a regular activity you might take on once or twice a week, because these are larger, more intensive initiatives you take on for several months. This is a way to 'dive deep' into a topic, cause or organisation you're passionate about, which further demonstrates to admissions officers your commitment to your field.



What Does Impact Look Like?

Beyond just having a leadership role or title, there's also a question of what you did with that responsibility. The effect of your work is also known as impact. Impact shows that you're passionate and invested in leaving your mark on a club, community or organisation by strengthening its influence or effectiveness. Here are some examples of impactful work on various levels:

School Local (Inter)National

- Raising \$5,000 for new library computers
- Leading a tutoring club with 30 tutors supporting 100 peers
- Lobbying for Meatless Mondays in your school cafeteria (and succeeding!)
- Increasing involvement amongst your peers as a City Youth Council member
- Starting a travelling library that reaches underserved communities
- Organising a 5K race to fundraise for a local charity or small business
- + Launching an educational YouTube channel that reaches a nationwide or global audience
- Representing your state or country at Model UN
- Winning a major academic or arts competition



A Well-Developed Profile

There is a strategy to develop your ECL Profile and stand out to admissions officers. In general, you will need:

- + 2 activities related to volunteering
- + 3-5 activities in which you are a leader
- + 1-3 academic activities
- + 1-2 non school affiliated activities (reputable summer camps)
- + At least 1 quirky activity reflecting more unusual skills or hobbies

Some activities can overlap to fulfill multiple requirements, aim for a balance of activities that showcase your talents, interests and dedication!

This student has not only met each category, but has gone above and beyond expectations by participating in highly diverse activities that a) are actual jobs in the career world, and b) participating in largely unconventional spaces for high schoolers. This person is clearly driven, motivated by social service, intelligent, and linguistically talented. Their leadership is institutional, innovative, and independent. In terms of impact, their work impacts school, local, and national communities.

Unsurprisingly, this student was a successful admit to Yale, Stanford, Columbia, Brown, UPenn, Duke, Cornell, and UChicago. What an accomplished high school student!

Below is another example of a Crimson student's extracurricular profile. 

Unlike the student in the first case study, this student hasn't filled out all of the categories. They have definitely done some great work thus far in their high school career, but there is actually very little leadership work exemplified here because their involvement is largely participatory. This student has an example of institutional leadership demonstrated by their VP status, but how could this person be more innovative and independent in their leadership?

Additionally, there is some variation in their activities, but there ultimately needs to be more. Finally, the impact of their extracurricular activities remains largely within their school.

Crimson Leadership Academy

The Crimson Leadership Academy focuses on helping students build and execute a Capstone Project. The Capstone is typically one of the strongest activities on a student's Activity List. This project can take on many forms and is tailored to the student's passions, interests, and academic timeline.

Your successful Capstone Project will be:

- → A memorable solution to an existing issue
- Oriented towards community service
- Interdisciplinary combining your passions, interests, and skills in a unique way
- → Measurable in its impact
- Fitting within your 'Hook Statement' or application 'theme'



The Capstone Project is different from other extracurricular activities because:

I. It is not just participatory.
Joining the soccer team or
playing on the marching band
does not require innovation
because the structures already
exist. These are great
extracurriculars, but not
Capstone Projects.

2. It combines diverse skills and interests. The Capstone Project is interdisciplinary. Perhaps a student loves horses and wants to participate in a state competition. This alone is also not a Capstone Project because it only deals with one skill set. Rather, the student should combine their love of horses with their desire to teach kids about the benefits of animal therapy. Perhaps they could start a horse camp for underprivileged kids.

You will also receive assistance from an ECL advisor, whose fundamental responsibility is to support students as they build their capstone project within the package hours that they have bought.


Indigo Summer Program


